## FR ALO WRITES...

## "Faith, Love and Rules"

Matthew 15:21-28

Women and children in Jesus' time were considered to be second class in socio-religious society. The Gospel writers tried their best to point out how Jesus approached this issue. And indeed Jesus' approach was different to the common approach of his time. In today's Gospel an extreme thing happened. It concerned not only a woman but also a non Jewish woman. This passage (Matthew 15:21) describes the only occasion in which Jesus ministered outside Jewish territory. (Tyre and Sidon were fifty miles, approximately 400kms north of Israel, and still exist today in modern Lebanon.) A Gentile woman, a foreigner who was not a member of the Jewish people, puts Jesus on the spot by pleading for his help. At first, Jesus seemed to pay no attention to her, and this made his disciples feel embarrassed. Jesus did this to awaken faith in her, and also to break down the belief that pagans (and women) were second class, and were not worthy to be treated like the Jews.

What did Jesus mean by the expression "throwing bread to the dogs"? The Jews often spoke disparagingly and looked down on the Gentiles by calling them "unclean dogs". It was because they did not understand the Torah or Law of Moses. This attitude was applied to women and children because they could not understand the Torah. There is another reference to "dogs" in Matthew's Gospel where Jesus says to his disciples, "Do not give to dogs what is holy" (Matthew 7:6). Jesus tests this woman's faith to see if she is earnest in receiving holy things from the hand of a holy God. Jesus, no doubt, spoke with a smile rather than with an insult because this woman immediately responds with wit and faith - "even the dogs eat the crumbs".

In the last few weeks, in one of my homilies, I said that there are many young couples who come to ask for baptism. Some couples are catholic, sometimes only one of them is catholic and sometimes both husband and wife are non catholic. Indeed I had some doubts about those couples who are not catholic. I suspected that they wanted to baptise their children to make it easier to go to our school. At least two couples admitted this. And I refused to baptise some of their children. Am I right to do that? I do not know the right answer. Probably, speaking of rules, I think I am right. However baptism does not only concern rules, but we can also see the spiritual side of it.

I met another parish priest a few days ago who has some issues like those I am facing now. However, his approach is different. He welcomes all of them and baptises the children. Indeed he had concerns about the faith of the parents, yet he did it out of love and trust that God will do it his way. He learnt from his experience in the past. A non catholic couple came to ask for baptism of their first child. They were sincere with their motive: "we want our son to go to your school, Father". The priest respected their honesty, so he baptised the child. The following year the couple came with their second child to be baptised with the same motive. The priest baptised her. It happened with the third one as well. Finally one day, to his surprise, the couple came and asked to be enrolled in the RCIA (Rite of the Christian Initiation of Adults) program in the parish. The priest could not believe what happened. He welcomed them with a big smile. Pope Francis reminds us to live and love all people. Our approach to people should be based on love and not rules. He said: "When we remain in love, the commandments follow on their own, out of love".
