LET YOUR FIRST WORDS BE "PEACE TO THIS HOUSE"
(LUKE 10:5)

The Prophet Isaiah concludes his book by promising that God will send peace flowing like a river upon all nations. St Paul in his letter to the Galatians reminds us that an inner change and becoming new people takes precedence over rituals, like circumcision within the Jewish culture or baptism within our own Christian tradition. This means that for Christians, it is not the fact that we are baptised that is of utmost importance. What is important is how we live our lives as people who are baptised; how we continually transform our lives and endeavour to live according to the teachings and precepts of Jesus. Paul pronounces peace and mercy to all who follow this rule, and he calls them "the Israel of God" – God's persevering people. In the Gospel, Jesus continues the theme of peace by instructing the seventy-two appointed and sent out, to firstly implore peace upon each house they entered. As labourers of the harvest, we too are called to be conveyers of peace, a peace founded in God's love and truth exemplified in the life of Jesus. There are many ways we can be workers of the harvest and people who celebrate harmony and diversity.

At this weekend's parish masses, we will have the MSC Mission Office Appeal. I am sure most of you are familiar with the work of the MSC Mission Office. Your support enables labourers of the harvest all over the world, clerics, religious and lay people, not only to spread the gospel message of Christ, but to all be the physical hands of Church, reaching out and helping the "little ones" all over the world.

This Sunday (July 3rd) also marks the beginning of NAIDOC Week – a week that celebrates the history, culture, and achievements, of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC week is an opportunity to recognise the contribution of Indigenous Australians to our country and society. We are all encouraged to participate in the many events organised to celebrate NAIDOC week. There is so much on for the whole family to learn and enjoy. 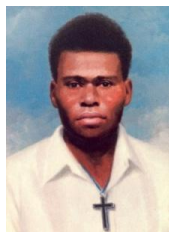

VOLUNTEERS REQUIRED FOR COURT SUPPORT

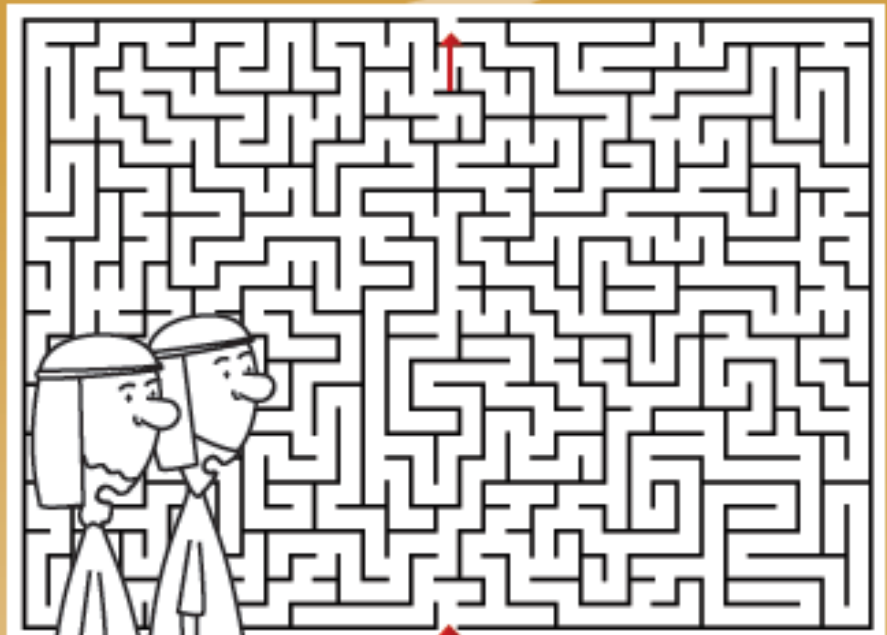
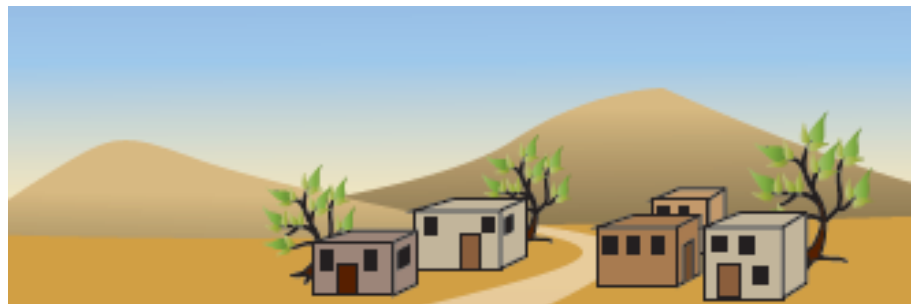
