# THE HEART UNITES THE FRAGMENTS ##17 ff

"At the same time, the heart makes all authentic bonding possible, since a relationship not shaped by the heart is incapable of overcoming the fragmentation caused by individualism... A society dominated by narcissism and self-centredness will increasingly become "heartless"... As a result, we also become incapable of openness to God. As [Philosopher] Heidegger puts it, to be open to the divine we need to build a "guest house".

...We become ourselves only to the extent that we acquire the ability to acknowledge others, while only those who can acknowledge and accept themselves are then able to encounter others.

The heart is also capable of **unifying and harmonizing** our personal history, which may seem **hopelessly fragmented**, yet is the place where everything can make sense. The Gospel tells us this in speaking of Our Lady, who saw things with the heart. She was able to dialogue with the things she experienced by pondering them in her heart, treasuring their memory and viewing them in a greater perspective. In Luke 2:51 what Mary "kept" was not only her memory of what she had seen and heard, **but also those aspects of it that she did not yet understand;** these nonetheless remained present and alive in her memory, **waiting to be "put together" in her heart.** 

In this age of artificial intelligence, we cannot forget that poetry and love are necessary to save our humanity. **No algorithm will ever be able to capture,** for example, **the nostalgia that all of us feel**, whatever our age, and wherever we live, when we recall [e.g. experiences of parental or neighbourly helpfulness from our childhood]: a smile we elicited by telling a joke... our concern for a fledgling bird fallen from its nest, a wish we made in plucking a daisy. **All these little things, ordinary in themselves yet extraordinary for us, can never be captured by algorithms**... all of these live on as precious memories "kept" deep in our heart.

This profound core, present in every man and woman, is not that of the soul, but of the entire person in his or her unique psychosomatic identity. Everything finds its unity in the heart, which can be the dwelling-place of love in all its spiritual, psychic and even physical dimensions. In a word, if love reigns in our heart, we become, in a complete and luminous way, the persons we are meant to be, for every human being is created above all else for love. In the deepest fibre of our being, we were made to love and to be loved.

Whenever a person thinks, questions and reflects on his or her true identity ... it leads to the realization that **our fulfilment as human beings is found in love. In loving, we sense that we come to know the purpose and goal of our existence in this world".** [c.f. The text and phone messages of people caught in the Twin Towers tragedy in New York – unfiltered words from the Heart...words of love and forgiveness, of the anguish of separation, of reconciliation where needed, of thoughtfulness and watchfulness from heaven.] "Everything comes together in a state of coherence and harmony. It follows that, in contemplating the meaning of our lives, perhaps the most decisive question we can ask is, **"Do I have a heart?" Pope Francis. "He loved us" - Encyclical on the Sacred Heart** 



Notre-Dame de Paris, the Cathedral Church of Our Lady of Paris. It is set to reopen on December 8, 2024, (Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary) following a restoration project estimated to cost upward of €700 million (US\$767 million).

Notre-Dame was built on **the ruins of two earlier churches** which were predated by a pre-Christian temple **dedicated to Jupiter**. In the 4th or 5th century, a large early Christian church, **the Cathedral of Saint Étienne**, was built on the site.

The present cathedral was initiated by **Maurice de Sully, bishop of Paris in 1160.** The western facade, and the nave were completed by 1250, and porches, chapels, and other embellishments were added over the next 100 years. Sully decided that the new church should be built in **the Gothic style**, which had been inaugurated at the royal abbey of **Saint Denis in the late 1130s.** 

An important innovation in the 13<sup>th</sup> Century was the introduction of **the flying buttress.** Through these the weight of the stone ceiling, the vault, was carried by the ribs of the vault **entirely to the outside of the structure to a series of arches ending in buttresses.** The buttresses meant that the walls could be higher and thinner and could have larger windows, with more space for light and the biblical stories in stained glass presented for **a non-literate public – this being before the invention of the printing press.** After the **French Revolution** in 1789, Notre-Dame and the rest of the Church's property in France was seized and made public **property.** The cathedral was "re-dedicated" in 1793 to **the cult of the "goddess of Reason":** a well-known **French Prostitute was installed on the High Altar in this name;** and this was followed by the **rationalist's Cult of the of the Supreme Being** in 1794.

Later, the cathedral came to be used as a warehouse for **the storage of food and other non-religious purposes.** In 1804 Napoleon crowned himself Emperor of France in the presence of the Pope, who he subsequently kidnapped. With the Concordat with the Church **in 1804 he restored Notre-Dame to the Catholic Church** – however, this **ended in the secularist "revolution" of 1904** which saw the expulsion and confiscations of all religious orders and their properties: de la Salle, Sacré-Coeur, MSC, OLSH etc, from France. Over time, the cathedral has gradually been stripped of many decorations and artworks. However, it still contains some of the most important relics in Christendom – **including the Crown of Thorns, and a sliver and nail from the crucifixion of Jesus** which were saved from the fire in 2009.

In the decades after the Napoleonic Wars (concluded with the decisive Battle of Waterloo in Belgium 1815), Notre-Dame fell into such a state of disrepair that the Paris Officials considered its demolition! Victor Hugo, who admired the Cathedral, wrote the novel The Hunchback of Notre-Dame in 1831 to save the Cathedral. It was an enormous success and public opinion caused the King to restore it in 1844. During the Paris Commune of March through May of 1871, the cathedral and other churches were closed and some 200 priests and the Archbishop of Paris were taken hostage. In May during the "Bloody Week" (cf *Les Miserables*) the *revolutionaries sought to burn the Cathedral*. However, they realised that the nearby Hospital with hundreds of patients (nursed by Augustinian Nuns) would be in danger, and desisted.

**2009:** After the fire, the main structure was intact, and firefighters saved the stained-glass windows and the Great Organ. The vaulting did have some holes in it where the tower crashed down. The Rooster Weathervane at the top of the wooden tower (fléche) (see pic front page) contained three relics: a tiny piece of the Crown of Thorns, and relics of Sts Denis and Genevieve, patron Saints of Paris. The plan to replace some windows with contemporary designs was rejected by the French Commission on Monuments and Patrimony. (Deo Gratia.) PHMSC


# CHRISTMAS STALL – SR DUCHESNE OLSH 23 & 24 NOVEMBER
