## NAIDOC WEEK: National Aboriginal and Islander Day of

Commemoration: The painting was given as a farewell gift from the St Mary's Cathedral School in Darwin to Fr Paul Cashen MSC. Sr Helen Armstrong OLSH commissioned Miriam Rose Ungunmerr Baumann, a well-known N.T. artist from Daly River to create it. In her adult life Miriam Rose became one of the first Aboriginal women to lead a Local Council. Under the mentorship of the OLSH Sisters she became the first full-descent Aboriginal Principal of a School. Two years ago, she became the Senior Australian of the year.

#### MOTHER LOVE

This painting depicts my expression of Mother Love encased in the Star, symbol of Mary, Our Heavenly Mother.

The inner circle represents the Mother. During her life she experiences joys and sorrows as she grows to womanhood.

The junction of the darker inner circle is the meeting with her husband. Their lives merge and as they grow together, children are born of the union.

These are represented by the half circles of yellow and brown. All are united as one.

The various dots and lines – some dark, some smooth, some jagged, depict the joys and sorrows of lives lived together as they move into age. The larger darker dots on the outside of the circle express the dimness as the life draws to a close.

The circle for us is a symbol of LIFE and WATER.

Within the seven-point Star, representative of the **Seven Sorrows of Mary**, I have depicted the five glorious mysteries of the Rosary.

- 1. **The Annunciation** there are two white circles the Angel and Mary.
- 2. **The Visitation** four circles, two large for Mary and Elizabeth, two small for Jesus and John the Baptist.
- 3. **The birth of Jesus** large circles are Mary and Joseph, and small circle is Jesus born to them of God's love.
- 4. **The Presentation in the Temple** Jesus, Mary, Joseph and Simeon.
- 5. The finding of Jesus in the Temple Mary and Joseph on each side of Jesus as they talk to the learned men.

The brightness of the Star shatters the darkness of life just as the beauty and love of Mary scatters the darkness of our lives. The dots within the light are the people we meet in life. We can bring them light or darkness depending on whether we lead them to Jesus and Mary or outward into darkness.

# THE GADIGAL CLANS - THE TRADITIONAL ABORIGINAL OWNERS OF THE LAND WE LIVE ON

The Gadigal originally inhabited the area that they call "Gadi", which lies south of Port Jackson, with Sydney Cove, where the first Union Jack was raised, marking the beginning of colonisation, and covering today's Sydney CBD and stretching from South Head across to Marrickville/Petersham with part of the southern boundary lying on the Cooks River. Since colonisation most Gadigal people have been displaced from their traditional lands. The Gadigal are one of seven clans who speak a common language, with another 22 clans in the greater Sydney metropolitan area known as the Eora people. "Eora" refers to "people" or "of this place" in Dharug language.

Soon after his arrival in 1788, **Governor Arthur Phillip** estimated the Aboriginal population of the area at around 1,500 people, although other estimates range from as low as 200 to as high as 4,000. The Gadigal clan was estimated to have 50-80 people. On 13 February 1790, just ten weeks after the capture of an Aboriginal man named **Woollarawarre Bennelong**, Phillip wrote to **Lord Sydney** (hence the name of our fair city) at the Home Office in London: *In last November (1789), two Natives were brought up, one of whom made his Escape a Few Days after; the other (i.e. Bennelong) lives with me and will soon be able to inform me of their Customs, & Manners.* In this document, held in the National Archives at Kew in England, **Governor Phillip recorded from Bennelong the names and locations of the major Aboriginal clans in the Sydney coastal area.** In exchanges enlivened by mimicry and fraught with misunderstanding, Bennelong and Phillip, who was twice his age, somehow found ways to break through the vast cultural barrier between them. They even talked together at night, when Bennelong told the governor his names for the Southern Hemisphere stars.

The colonisation of the land by British settlers and the subsequent introduction of infectious diseases including smallpox, decimated the Gadigal people and their neighbours, extending far into the interior following Aboriginal trade routes even before European settlers arrived west of the Blue Mountains. The 1789 Smallpox epidemic was estimated to have killed about 50% of the Eora population, with only three Gadigal survivors. However, archaeological evidence suggests that some Gadigal people may have escaped to the Concord area and settled there.

Gadigal Elder Allen Madden estimates that several hundred Dharug people, including at least a hundred Gadigal people in his own family, live in Sydney today. Aboriginal communities here were both generous and combative towards the colonisers. (Taken from various sources.)

Aboriginal Dreaming about Sydney Harbour and how it came into existence - a narrative conveying intense moral and social implications for the people: The Eel Dreaming: 'Everyone and everything was peaceful. The sea was much further to the East than it is now. Initiated people were taken to the ceremonial ground of the Eel Spirit, and they received the spirit to protect them. But it had obligations on the part of the initiated. Over time, people became lazy and wasteful of the food they gathered and hunted. They forgot to teach the culture and laws to their children; they failed to give thanks for the food they received, and lost respect for the Earth Mother. They soon found themselves divided into warring clans, stealing from others. Cameroi guarded the homeland and was wounded by a spear during some fighting. The Eel Spirit swam to the surface of the pool to help his old friend. A great chasm opened in the ground and a storm came and the waters rushed in (forming Sydney Harbour), swallowing up the disobedient and warring troublemakers. The sea creatures then retaught the people the laws for them to keep, to maintain a peaceful environment.' (Taken from a delightful video, but I can't vouch for the total accuracy of how I have rendered this.)

In October 2023, the New South Wales government renamed a Sydney Metro station to Gadigal Station whilst it was under construction, which had formerly been named as Pitt Street station. (A very good move, I think) PHMSC
