The Year of Luke (Year C)

We do not know much about the personal life of Luke to provide even a basic historical outline. **Early Christian tradition** says he was unmarried, and wrote in Greek to Greeks, and died in the year 84 in Boetia, a region of Central Greece. The early Christian historian **Eusebius** says he lived in Antioch. **St Gregory Nazianzen** writing in the 300s says Luke died a martyr's death. An even later tradition states that he was one of the 70 disciples Jesus sent out to go before him and, also that he was one of the two on the Road to Emmaus...

St Paul mentions Luke – "his dear friend and doctor" in Col 4:14. In 2 Tim Paul states "only Luke is with me…". In Phil 24, Paul calls Luke his "colleague". **These references have usually been assumed to be about Luke the Gospel and Acts author.**

Luke - Acts is a large work in 2 volumes. He presents an expansive idea of the salvation offered by Jesus as embracing all people. In his work he refers to six miracles and 18 parables that are not mentioned in the other Synoptic Gospels of Mark and Matthew – material he alone had access to. While Matthew reproduces 97% of Mark in his Gospel, Luke draws on 80% of Mark's Gospel, suggesting that he had a shortened version of it in circulation. Mark's Gospel reproduced in Luke accounts for about one third of Luke's Gospel. About 200 verses are taken from another written source in circulation in the Early Church called Q (German for *Source*) which Luke and Matthew had access to – a collection of sayings of Jesus. These three Gospels, Matthew, Mark and Luke, are called the Synoptic Gospels (syn-as in like, and optics – view...i.e. a similar view of the ministry of Jesus.)

Luke organizes his Gospel around the theme of Jesus' Journey to Jerusalem where Jesus would die and then Rise, and that from Jerusalem the Gospel, propelled by the Holy Spirit, would spread out to all the world. One of Luke's major concerns is to show that the ministry, passion, crucifixion, and resurrection of Jesus are the fulfillment of the Jewish scriptures (i.e., Moses, the prophets, and the Psalms).

In contrast to both Mark and Matthew, Luke's gospel is clearly written more for a gentile (non-Jewish) audience. He has an educated style. Notably, Luke's Gospel removes any blame for the Crucifixion from the Roman authorities. Scholars ask why that might be? They think to persuade the Roman authorities to recognize Christianity as a respectable religion in the Empire. Luke endeavours to show that non-Jews can belong to God's elect, be included in God's plan for salvation. E.g. Luke has Jesus praising the faith of a Roman Centurion, a non-Jew, and he makes a good Samaritan, an enemy of the Jews, the exemplar of a parable of mercy.

Luke is especially noted for **the Parables of Mercy**, the kindness of Jesus to outcasts and women, his love of gathering people for meals. Other minorities or marginalized groups also take centre stage in Luke: the role of women and the poor are highlighted. Another major theme in Luke is the compassion of Jesus for the outcasts and sinners: Zacchaeus, and the thief crucified beside Jesus being examples. Also, Luke is not quite as tough on the Apostles' **performance, their failures, as are the other Gospel writers.** Just as the Holy Spirit guided Jesus in his ministry, so the Holy Spirit is seen in the Acts of the Apostles as **guiding the Church in her ministry in the name of Jesus.** I encourage you to read this beautiful work together with the Acts of the Apostles. 
PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL AND FINANCE COMMITTEES: I will contact you to make a time for meetings in the next couple of weeks.
