MSC Mission Office Appeal

Beginnings: 1999 – that's 25 years ago, the MSC Mission Office was begun in one room in the Monastery. **Fr Adrian Meaney MSC**, whom most of you will remember, was the first Director. The idea of the Office came from him and it was approved at a Provincial Chapter (a special six-yearly gathering to stock-take the life of the Australian MSC Province). Fr Adrian was absolutely passionate about the missionary outreach of our Province. He had lived in MSC ministries in the NT and PNG and knew first-hand the problems missionaries and people alike faced.

Wherever the Catholic Church is found there will also be the three pillars of its life: Health Care, Education and Social Welfare that together go hand in hand with Evangelisation – which according to the MSC Motto is - May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be Everywhere Loved, Forever. Of course, for people to actually respond to the love of the Heart of Jesus, they first have to encounter that love. As one of our most loveable and down-to-earth MSCs, Fr Pat Moloney, said on his arrival in Alice Springs to establish the Church there, not long after the railway arrived in 1929: "We first have to put food in their bellies, attend to the sick and find meaningful work for the unemployed before we can preach the love of Christ and his Church to them." As Jules Chevalier, the founder of the MSC noted, "Jesus began firstly by doing - healing the sick and feeding the hungry before he taught the crowds the Good News of the Kingdom." Fr Moloney and his confreres, soon to be joined by the OLSH Sisters, was ministering to the Aboriginal population of Alice Springs, in what he stated was, at the time, a "most racist town." The 400 or so Aboriginal people were the remnants of tribes who had been displaced by the advancing pastoral leases. Alice had a European population of around 400.

And that order of contacting people who had never heard of Jesus or the Church, was bascally the order of missionary endeavour all over the world: Matthew 25 spells it out: "The Lord said: I was sick and in prison and you visited me, hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me to drink...When did we see **YOU** sick, in prison, hungry and thirsty? Whenever you did it to these, the least, you did it to **ME**." Jesus totally identifies with all, but especially "the least". Like so many congregations, the MSC and OLSH have a beautiful history of going to the least, to the margins, and we continue to do that Our numbers are diminishing as you know, as next year we will

that. Our numbers are diminishing as you know, as next year we will have eight in our Australian Formation program to become MSCs. The Mission Office is our major pathway to reach out to the margins.

Fr Roger Purcell took over the leadership of the MSC Mission Office with the death of Fr Meaney. Roger has spent most of his priesthood ministering in PNG and brings a wealth of first-hand experience to the Office. He is the editor of the MSC Mission Outreach Newsletter. Over the 25 years of its existence from such humble beginnings, the Office has raised over \$25,000,000 for the most vulnerable of people in many countries – and not only for MSC-OLSH needs. The most recent Newsletter – available in the foyer – features the devastating landslide in Enga, PNG. As is noted in the Newsletter, "Initially the Mission Office gave \$10,000 from our Health Fund. Within a week an online appeal yielded another \$55,000." Of course, there is more to Aid than \$\$ - and in conjunction with the local Church authorities the Office is in touch with the ongoing needs in area of the landslide.

The "Reach" of the Mission Office is evident in the latest **Newsletter:** the **PNG** landslide mentioned above. The **Philippines**: An Agricultural Cooperative; programs funding school fees and nutritious food for schools; Laudato Si Centre, Cebu; clean water programs and many more areas of help. It is noted that there are over 20 young men in the MSC Seminary in the Philippines. In **Vietnam**: many individuals and families are assisted with education and health care issues; remote parishes with Clean water projects and health care (From previous Newsletters). The MSC began in Vietnam only in 2000. There is now a thriving, youthful community of over 30 members with great energy for mission, especially to the margins. The novices are formed in Manilla. Fiji also features in the Newsletter: a very special work of the MSC there is the **Chevalier Training Centre**. It is a quite unique Vocational Training Centre offering certified courses in Welding, Automotive, Cabinet Making and General Carpentry, Farm Management, Technical Drawing. There are two volunteers from Germany, 10 staff and an **MSC.** It is focused mainly on underprivileged male students – some from broken homes, rejected youth, ex-prisoners. Read MSC Community leader Fr Vito's Report in the Newsletter. You may be inspired to become a volunteer to, and certainly to assist **financially** in the costs of running the institute which needs a major upgrade following the inroads of the Covid lock-downs. It requires an injection of \$200,000. In Burkina Faso, a very poor Nation in northwest Africa, the Office has helped over many years an OLSH girls boarding school and helping girls complete their education "despite attacks by Jihadists in this region".

There is a section titled: "Where There is a Will there is a Way" for you to make provision in your will to support the Office in its work.

The Back Page of the Newsletter has a delightful "KIDS CORNER" with informative little items for children to participate in.

Finally, the list of countries where the Office has been active over the past 12 months: Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Congo DR, Namibia, Senegal, Sth Africa, Sudan (all in Africa); Fiji, India, Indonesia, Kiribati, PNG Philippines, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Vietnam.

The total outgoings for the past 12 months: \$1,308,021.
