OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY PARISH AUGUST 25 2024 | TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME | YEAR B



Fr. Jules Chevalier, a very young French priest at the time, founded the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart (MSC) in 1854, and the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in 1874. Both communities were founded in the small city of Issoudun, central France. During the 19th Century France was disturbed by the ongoing effects of the 1789 Revolution which saw the radical separation of Church and State and the confiscation of Church properties together with the suppression of Religious Orders. The century following the Revolution saw a truly remarkable flowering of the Church in France with numerous religious communities being founded or re-founded. There was a tremendous energy for mission, including an extensive overseas missionary effort, undertaken even while the French Church struggled to rebuild. Issoudun was considered to be Ground Zero for the ongoing de-Christianisation of France in that period. It was there that Jules Chevalier began his two communities and, not surprisingly, struggled to find vocations, initially.

The OLSH sisters began when a community of sisters from Paris asked to join Fr Chevalier, captivated by his devotion to Our Lady under the title of OLSH. 16 or so arrived in Issoudun, but the transplant did not take on. Those sisters were used to a more enclosed, contemplative life, whereas Jules wanted a very active, missionary community, with, of course, a strong community life, contemplatives at heart.

In 1882, Fr. Chevalier appointed a very reluctant Marie Louise Hartzer as leader of the then small, struggling, community. Marie Louise was born in Alsace, France in 1837. She first married, had two sons, and later, as a 45-year-old widow, joined the young congregation of the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart. Her two sons became Missionaries of the Sacred Heart. For 26 years (1882-1908), she guided the OLSH sisters, faithfully passing on the founder's charism and spirituality to them.


On 9th September 1884, the first profession of vows ceremony took place, including that of Marie Louise. The Congregation now had 5 professed members. Just two months later on October 17th, five sisters set out for the great mission of Oceania and arrived in Sydney on January 31, 1885. Their destination was the missions of Oceania – PNG and Kiribati.

Amazingly, two sisters had made their vows a few hours before they disembarked from Barcelona. They had the great sum of 25 francs between them, out of which had to be bought a pair of shoes for one sister in Marseille! Their letters back to Mother Hartzer reflect a group of young women, filled with joy and good humour as they faced a truly unknown destiny about as far away from France as it was possible to get. Further, their chances of ever returning to France, even for a holiday, were remote.

France in the 1880s was under the governance of yet another anti-clerical party. They had confiscated the monastery and houses of the MSC and other male religious orders. The sisters did not lose their convent at that time but were not allowed to be seen in a religious habit or do pastoral work.

On arrival in Australia the Sisters were met by Fr. Navarre, MSC who had come from **Thursday Island where the MSC had already set up a base to supply their missions in PNG.** Like the MSC before them, they were given hospitality by the Marists at Villa Maria, Hunters Hill, the headquarters of the Marists. A small house on the property was placed at their disposal until they could have a convent of their own.

Also meeting them was a 19-year-old woman, Margaret Sweeney, from Ryde, who was seeking a missionary congregation to enter.

Archbishop Moran offered a place to the MSC/OLSH if they established a parish and school. They accepted Botany. Four of the sisters were French, but one was Irish, Sr. M. Xavier Ryan. Sr. M. Xavier began a small school beside the church on Botany Road in April,1885. It was here that the work of the OLSH sisters in Australia began. As they outgrew the small convent at Botany, the MSC had bought land at Kensington and the Sisters settled next door. Their first, temporary, Kensington Convent was a house in Todman Avenue, while the Convent on the sand hill was built and opened in 1897.

Margaret Sweeney was the first of many young Australian women to join the Daughters. Like her, these recruits often left our shores to work overseas. In 1886, the first Sisters went to Thursday Island where they were promptly put in charge of the local hospital. The following year Sisters went to Yule Island off Papua. This was followed by a foundation in Kiribati, at that time one of the most remote places in the entire globe. Then followed more foundations in NSW. In 1905, four sisters left for Mathina in Tasmania, followed shortly after by more foundations in Tasmania. In 1908 the first five Daughters left for Darwin. In 1916, a foundation was made in Queensland, in 1929 in Victoria, in 1947 in South Australia.

Aspects of the Spirituality of the OLSH Sisters: *Like Mary, we want to build our lives on the example of Jesus.*

"We experience in faith the forgiving, healing and transforming power of his love. We are impelled to live and proclaim this love...." (FDNSC Constitutions No 5).

We want to communicate God's love as shown to us by the compassionate heart of Jesus. "... leading others to know that in Jesus, God loves them with a human heart and is the answer to their hopes, their questionings and their every need." (FDNSC Constitutions No 5)

Our mission is to make this love known everywhere and to everyone without conditions. Our motto is: "May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be everywhere loved". To be continued.


