16TH OCTOBER - FEAST OF ST MARGARET MARY ALACOQUE – SAINT OF THE SACRED HEART

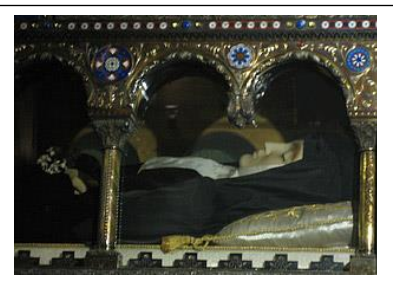
Margaret Mary Alacoque was born in Burgundy, France 1647 and died in 1690. As was not uncommon in those days, her father died when she was eight and she was sent to a convent of Poor Clares for her education. After a year she suffered a painful rheumatic illness which kept her bed-ridden for 6 years. She was treated harshly by an uncle and aunt who held the family's cash. When her brother turned 17 he gained control of the family's inheritance and things improved.

Although many encouraged her to marry, she had made up her mind to enter the convent of the Visitation nuns at Paray-le-Monial. Early on in her life as a nun she received revelations of the Lord. **He showed her his heart and asked her to make known to the world the great love he held for all people in his heart.** Over a period of 18 months she had further revelations in which **the Sacred Heart of Jesus was depicted as a Heart of flesh.**

He told her that she and others should make reparation for the coldness and insults he received in return for his love, **by being people filled with his love.** He directed her to institute a **Feast Day for the Sacred Heart** after Corpus Christi Day. He requested that Catholics receive Holy Communion on the nine **First Fridays of every month** and spend an hour in prayer on a **Thursday evening in remembrance of his sufferings in Gethsemane.**

When Margaret Mary endeavoured to carry out these instructions **she met with staunch opposition from her superior and some of the nuns.** **Theologians** decided that she was deluded and that she should eat more! **Her confessor**, Claude de la Columbiere, a young Jesuit, and later beatified, came to her help. **Little by little the devotion was accepted in the convent and a chapel built.** It had an immediate, positive impact across all sectors of the Church. It spread through other Visitation Convents. The Jesuits also helped spread it through their magazines. The devotion did not start with her but has its origins with **St Gertrude (13th Century Abbess).** However, **in its modern form it began with Margaret Mary and was an antidote to the rigorism, the coldness of Jansenism which infected the French Church.**

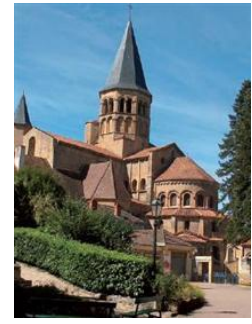
She wrote: *"This divine Heart is an ocean full of all good things, wherein poor souls can cast all their needs; it is an ocean full of joy to drown all our sadness, an ocean of humility to drown our folly, an ocean of mercy for those in distress, an ocean of love in which to submerge our poverty."* PHMSC



St Margaret Mary's – incorrupt body



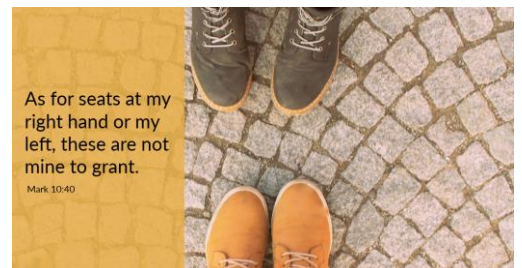
Chapel of Apparitions, Convent of Visitation, Paray-le-Monial

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY - ROME CONCLUDING FOUR WEEKS OF MEETINGS IS PUBLISHED.

TOPICS: Women and the laity, diaconate, ministry and magisterium, peace and the climate, the poor and migrants, ecumenism and identity, new languages and renewed structures, old and new missions (including the “digital” mission), listening to all and probing everything more deeply, even the most 'controversial' issues. In the Synthesis Report there is a renewed look at the world and the Church and their demands.

Listening to all, beginning with victims of abuse: reaffirms an “openness to listening and accompanying all, including those who have suffered abuse and hurt in the Church”, while “addressing the **structural conditions that abetted such abuse**, remains before us, and **requires concrete gestures of penitence**”.

A synodal Church? What does this mean? The participants themselves admit it is “**a term unfamiliar to many members of the People of God, causing some people confusion and concern**”: including fears of a departure from tradition, a debasement of the hierarchical nature of the Church, a loss of power or, on the contrary, immobility and a lack of courage for change. “Synodal” and “synodality” are instead terms that “**speak of a mode of being Church that integrates communion, mission, and participation**”. So they indicate a way of living the Church, valuing differences **and developing the active involvement of all**. This begins with deacons, priests, and bishops: “We need an understanding of the reasons for resistance to synodality by some...”

Synodality goes hand in hand with mission. Hence, it is necessary that “Christian communities are to enter into solidarity with those of other religions, convictions and cultures, thus avoiding, on the one hand, the risk of self-referentiality and self-preservation, and on the other hand the risk of loss of identity.” In this new “pastoral style”, it would seem important to many **to make “liturgical language more accessible to the faithful and more embodied in the diversity of cultures.”**

Much thought is devoted to the poor. “For the Church, the option for the poor and those at the margins is a **theological category before being a cultural, sociological, political or philosophical category**” – i.e. **it comes from the Gospel itself**. The document identifies the poor not only as those who are materially impoverished, but also migrants; indigenous peoples; victims of violence and abuse, especially women, or racism and trafficking; people with addictions; minorities; abandoned elderly people; and exploited workers. Among “**the most vulnerable of the vulnerable, on whose behalf constant advocacy is needed, [are] the unborn and their mothers**”, the document continues. “The Assembly hears the cry of the ‘**new poor**’, **produced by wars and terrorism that plague many countries on several continents**, and the assembly condemns **the corrupt political and economic systems that cause such strife**”.
